Dear Robert:

At a recent meeting, the Committee on Admissions voted unanimously to accept your application for admission to Trinity College. Naturally, in granting you admission, the Committee requires that you complete satisfactorily your present course of study.

There will be 250 young men in the Class of 1959, this year's entering class. The number of applications is considerably greater than in recent years, and the competition for places in this class is very great. The Committee on Admissions has decided that, in all fairness to the many candidates, we must require each accepted student to pay a deposit to hold his place in the class. This deposit must be paid by May 1st. The deposit fee is \$50, and, while not returnable in the case of withdrawal, will be applied against your college bill for the first term. Checks or money orders should be made payable to the Trustees of Trinity College.

The first two paragraphs of this letter probably seem very formal, but they bring you a very warm welcome to the Class of 1959 at Trinity College. I know that you will justify the college's confidence in you.
