# Board To Mull Report On Teaching Approach

THOMASTON — A report on an interdisciplinary approach to education will be discussed Monday at the Board of Education meeting at 8 p.m., in Thomaston High School.

Robert Pingpank and other school department heads will present various reports.

Charles Halbrook will discuss a summer theater program.

Other items on the agenda include the development of the 1973-74 budget document; an inspection report by the state Department of Health; roof work needs, and work on the gymnasium and auditorium.

Old business on the agenda includes open house programs; a contract with Connecticut Junior Republic Association; a delivery of a dental chair and operating unit; trips to Spain and Washington, D. C., and a time change for board meetings.

Approval of a new scholarship

award is scheduled under new business, along with reports on a delegate assembly and a trip to Mystic seaport.

A report from School Supt. Martin Yaffee will be made. It will include details on a leadership curriculum workshop day, unemployment compensation, a preliminary staff survey, Kaynor Technical School, a cooperative purchasing plan and trends in financial support for public schools.

Personnel policy discussion will be on teacher and board negotiations, maternity leave and a part-time secretarial position at the high school.

A report by the high school Building Committee is also scheduled with a review and sketch of the proposed building.

The board will also discuss the basic transportation contract, negotiations for auxiliary vehicles, state inspection and federal regulations.
