

Canons at Christ Church Cathedral, Hartford
from the Constitution and Statutes Of The Cathedral Church of the Diocese (2003)

from the Statutes

Section II The Staff Canons. The Staff Canons shall be responsible for discharging such duties in the worship and the administration of the Cathedral as shall be assigned to them by the Dean or Provost.

The Staff Canons shall be elected by the Chapter, on joint nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost.

All Staff Canons shall retain this title while a member of the Cathedral staff.

Upon retirement or resignation, the Chapter, upon nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost, may grant the title "Canon Emeritus" to Staff Canons.

Section III Honorary Canons

A. Special Honorary Canons. Special Honorary Canons may be lay or ordained persons who shall be elected for the special representative character of their ministries. They may be elected by the Chapter on the joint nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost, and shall thereafter hold office for five years and then may be elected to additional five year terms. There shall be no more than six Special Honorary Canons at one time.

B. Retired Honorary Canons. There may be elected by the Chapter as Honorary Retired Canons clergy persons retired from active full-time ministry, who shall retain this title for life on the joint nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost. There shall not be more than six Honorary Retired Canons at one time.

C. Honorary Canon Scholars. Persons who have satisfactorily completed the Honorary Canon Scholars Continuing Education Program of the Cathedral may be elected by the Chapter as Honorary Canon Scholars on the recommendation of the Director of the Canon Scholars Program and the joint nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost.

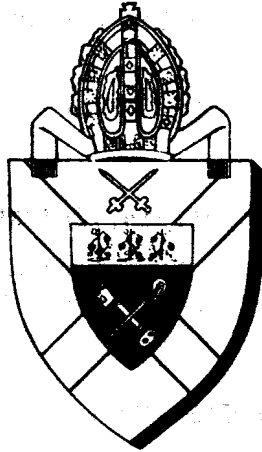
All Honorary Canons are to be members of the Chapter with voice only.

Section IV The Canon Precentor. A person may, on joint nomination of the Bishop and the Dean or Provost, be elected by the Chapter as the Canon Precentor, who shall have the overview of the music of the Cathedral under the direction of the Dean or Provost.

THE INVESTITURE

Honorary Canons of Christ Church Cathedral

PRESENTER: Arthur, Bishop of Connecticut, I present to you the Very Reverend William David Wightman, Provost of St. Andrew's Cathedral in Aberdeen, Scotland to be admitted as an Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral representing the Episcopal Church of Scotland and the Diocese of Aberdeen and Orkney.

Arthur, Bishop of Connecticut, I present to you the Very Reverend Philip Williams Turner, Dean of Berkeley Divinity School at Yale to be admitted as an Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral representing the theological education community of the Episcopal Church in the United States and Divinity Schools at Yale University.

Arthur, Bishop of Connecticut, I present to you the Reverend Richard Thomas Nolan, Associate for Education at Christ Church Cathedral and Professor of Philosophy and Social Science at Mattatuck Community College, to be admitted as an Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral representing the educational community of the State of Connecticut, and the non-parochial clergy of the Diocese of Connecticut and in honor of his volunteer service as a member of the Cathedral staff during the past four years.

Arthur, Bishop of Connecticut, I present to you the Reverend David Lawrence Cannon, Rector of St. James' Church, Poquetanuck to be admitted as an Honorary Canon of Christ Church Cathedral representing the parochial clergy of the Diocese of Connecticut and in recognition of his long and devoted service to this Diocese, his parish and his Cathedral.

BISHOP:

My Brothers, you were duly elected a Canon of this Cathedral upon the joint nomination of the Provost and Bishop at a meeting of the Chapter on October 21, 1991. Will you be faithful to all the duties of this office for the Glory of God and the Good of His Church?

CANON ELECT: I will, God being my helper.

And I, by the authority committed unto me, acknowledge you a Canon of this Cathedral in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. AMEN.

O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of your providence, carry out in tranquility the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. AMEN.
