

College Offering New Course

A Roman Catholic college will offer a course in Protestant Christianity starting Monday.

The course is being taught at St. Joseph College, 1678 Asylum Ave. in West Hartford, through July 16. Formally entitled "Aspects of Protestant Christianity," it will be taught by the Rev. Richard T. Nolan, special assistant to the academic dean of the Hartford Seminary Foundation.

The Rev. Mr. Nolan is visiting assistant professor of religion at St. Joseph. His three-credit course is designed to acquaint

students with the traditions and beliefs of non-catholic Christians.

Some lectures in the daily 8:30 to 11 a.m. course will be given by visiting non-Catholic theologians. Dr. Charles Wesley Ranson, professor of theology and ecumenics at the seminary and former dean of the Drew University Theological School, will discuss "Toward a Protestant Theology of Missions" on Monday.

On July 8, Dr. George A. Rigan, Riley Professor of systematic theology at the seminary and author of "Messianic Theology and Christian Faith" will discuss "American Approaches to Theological Language."

The Rev. Mr. Nolan is a doctoral candidate at New York University.

He holds a masters degree from Yale and has taught religion and philosophy at the University of Miami, Long Island

University, Trinity College and Central Connecticut State College. He is editor and contributor to "The Diaconate Now."
