

# Waltham-Born Cleric Named to 2 Posts

The Rev. Richard T. Nolan, grandson of Mrs. Charles A. Leishman of Beaver Brook Apartments, Grove St., Waltham, and assistant professor of philosophy and history at Mattatuck Community College, Waterbury, Conn., has been appointed director of parish education for Trinity Episcopal Church, Bristol, Conn., and lecturer in theology at St. Joseph's (Roman Catholic) College, West Hartford, Conn.

Ordained a deacon in 1963 in Christ Church, Waltham, and two years later to the priesthood in Arlington, Fr. Nolan is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas M. Nolan Jr., formerly of Waltham, now residing in Ft. Lauderdale Fla. Mr. Nolan is the former owner

of Jean's Restaurant, Moody St.

At Trinity Church, Bristol, Fr. Nolan's home since 1967, the Waltham-raised cleric will have the responsibility for revitalizing and structuring the parish's education program for its 700 members. At St. Joseph's College he will teach one course per term in world religions, Protestant theology, and the Anglican Communion.

His full-time position at the community college, where he began two years ago, involves setting up and teaching courses in philosophy and religious studies as well as western civilization.

A candidate for a Ph. D. degree at New York University, Fr. Nolan was elected this year to "Outstanding Educators of America," and his biography will be published in the 1971 volume of that organization.
